Information about the Environment and for travellers in Crete:

The mountain fortress Koules at Magarikari

Birthplace of the freedom fighter Jorgos Petrakogiorgis

The mountain fortress is located on the route from Zaros (over Voriza) to Kamares. In the village Voriza turn left (towards south) and reach soon after the village Magarikari where at the village exit (after around 200 m on the left roadside) stands a large monument of the famous freedom fighter Jorgos Petrakogiorgis (see picture right). Magarikari (450 m above SL), mentioned for the first time by the Venetians in the 15th Century is the birthplace of the freedom fighter and was almost completely destroyed by the Germans during the occupation during





Around 100 m further north is (also left) a "Stone Monolith" with an engraved map of the region and its villages (see image left). Immediately afterwards branch left a path which leads, passing a small Chapel, after approx 500 m to the fortress hill (see picture below left)

According to different sources, the mountain fortress Koules was build by the Venetians or the Turks; for the latter speaks the word "Koules", meaning "Fortress" in Turkish.

Not only the panorama with its views over the Messara-plateau or to the Asteroussia mountains impresses on the fortress hill (see picture below right), especially the fortress and its interior offer interesting motifs; therefore see the additional pictures on page 2.
